
Who Are We?

The Mobile Crisis Outreach Team (MCOT) is an interdisciplinary mobile team comprised of Psychiatrists, Registered Nurses, Licensed Master's Level Clinicians, Bachelor Level Clinicians, and Psychiatric Technicians specializing in crisis intervention.

Community-based in Harris County, MCOT provides services to Children and Adults who are experiencing a mental health crisis.

Who is Eligible for Services?

All Residents of Harris County willing to voluntarily accept MCOT services are eligible.

MCOT services are targeted for people who are:

- In a mental health crisis but are unable and/or initially unwilling to access services through a traditional psychiatric outpatient setting
- At risk for hospitalization without immediate intervention.
- Not in acute crisis but in need of outreach services to prevent further deterioration and to ensure and to ensure linkage to appropriate outpatient psychiatric services and community services.

What Services are Available?

- Crisis Intervention
- Psychiatric Assessment
- Brief Therapy
- Nursing Services
- Nutrition Education
- Substance Abuse Assessment
- Intensive Case Management
- Medication management to include initiation, restart or adjustment, as warranted
