Lance Britt is VP of Behavioral Health. He shared about the supports provided at each new location.

"We have one LPHA at each site one day a week. They complete either walk-in or pre-scheduled adult assessments," Lance described. "Upon completion, the LPHAs register the patients into Epic and make them a doctor appointment at a clinic of their choosing."

In addition to the four new access points, The Harris Center provides outpatient and crisis mental health services and IDD supports across more than 85 locations throughout Harris County.



Harris Center Employees Complete CMA Certification

The Medical Assistant Tuition Program was made possible by The Harris Center Foundation and its supporters. The program provided an opportunity for Harris Center team members to transition to Certified Medical Assistant (CMA) positions. Through a partnership with Houston Community College, graduates participated in a 9-month program that prepared them for certification as CMAs. An integral part of our treatment teams, the CMA graduates will provide care alongside nursing and medical staff at The Harris Center.
