

Specialized Therapies: Music Therapy

SERVICE DESCRIPTION	Musical or rhythmic interventions are utilized to assist the participant in accomplishing the restoration, maintenance, or improvement of social or emotional functioning, mental processing, or physical health. Music therapy provides a participant the opportunity to move from isolation into active participation through an increase in verbal and nonverbal communication, social expression, behavioral and social functioning, and self-awareness.
PROVIDER QUALIFICATIONS	A music therapy provider must be: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="552 651 1443 861">1. A licensed professional with documented training and experience relative to the specialized therapy being provided. This may include a: clinical social worker; professional counselor; marriage and family therapist; registered nurse; vocational nurse; physical therapist; occupational therapist; or dietitian; or</li><li data-bbox="552 882 1443 945">2. Certified by the Certification Board for Music Therapists (MT-BC).</li></ol>
WRAPAROUND PLAN	The Wraparound Plan must describe: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="552 1029 1443 1092">1. The skills training that will be provided to participant, as they relate to achieving the participant's identified goal(s);</li><li data-bbox="552 1113 1443 1176">2. The strategies and/or action steps that will be used to assist the participant in achieving the identified goal(s); and</li><li data-bbox="552 1197 1443 1239">3. The type, scope, and duration of the service.</li></ol>
PROGRESS NOTES	Progress notes are required for the provision of music therapy and must include: <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li data-bbox="552 1344 1443 1386">1. Participant name;</li><li data-bbox="552 1407 1443 1449">2. Date of contact with the participant;</li><li data-bbox="552 1470 1443 1512">3. Start and stop time of contact with the participant;</li><li data-bbox="552 1533 1443 1575">4. Service name and description;</li><li data-bbox="552 1596 1443 1638">5. Service location;</li><li data-bbox="552 1659 1443 1701">6. Wraparound plan objective(s) that was the focus of the service;</li><li data-bbox="552 1722 1443 1764">7. Participant response to nutritional counseling being provided;</li><li data-bbox="552 1785 1443 1827">8. Progress or lack of progress in achieving Wraparound Plan goals; and</li><li data-bbox="552 1848 1443 1890">9. Direct service provider's signature and credentials.</li></ol>

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PROVISION OF SERVICE DOCUMENTATION	The provider must document the provision of music therapy by maintaining up-to-date progress notes, which will be reviewed by the Department of State Health Services.
PROGRAM TRAINING	Prior to providing Waiver services and/or participating on a Child and Family Team, a music therapy provider must receive program training in accordance with PROGRAM TRAINING REQUIREMENTS, policy 2200.2 or 2300.2 of this manual, as applicable.
BILLING	Information regarding unit designation, payment rate, and required documentation for submitting a claim for music therapy is detailed in BILLING, SPECIALIZED THERAPIES, policy 2600.20 of this manual.

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
