The Harris Center Receives 3-Year CCBHC Renewal

The Harris Center is pleased to announce another three-year renewal as a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC). This accomplishment helps pursue The Harris Centers goal of becoming the most innovative behavioral health system in the country.

Being a CCBHC enables The Harris Center to better provide a comprehensive range of mental health and substance use disorder services to vulnerable individuals.

A Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC) is a specially-designated clinic that provides a <u>comprehensive range of mental health and substance use services</u>. The CCBHC model alleviates decades-old challenges that have led to a crisis in providing access to mental health and substance use care.



Feeding Disorders Program Featured by International Association

The Harris Center's Feeding Disorders Program was featured in the <u>International Association of Pediatric Feeding and Swallowing newsletter</u>. The Clinic helps individuals who struggle with food and/or liquid refusal, texture or type selectivity, general mealtime problem behavior and refusal to self-feed, all of which can result in difficulty maintaining their nutritional status. Feeding therapy provides an evidence-based behavioral approach to address all these concerns. Our Feeding Disorders Program is effective and here to serve individuals in and beyond Harris County.



Integrated Family Planning Opioid Response Program's Day of Awareness

Harris County Public Health has partnered with the Harris Center and the Texas Clinic to combat the opioid epidemic in Harris County. This program will provide Medication

Assisted Treatment (MAT) services, counselling, recovery coaching, and mental health services.

The Integrated Family Planning Opioid Response (IFPOR) program implements prevention, treatment, and recovery support strategies. We offer a comprehensive approach, which includes opioid overdose prevention and education, connecting patients to opioid treatment and recovery services, as well as providing overdose reversal education and Naloxone (Narcan).

Crisis Residential Unit (CRU) at Caroline and Southmore

Short-term residential alternative to hospitalization, CRU provides medication, psychotherapy and intensive psychosocial rehabilitation to promote re-entry into the community. Individuals participate in group therapy in the following areas: problem solving, communication, life skills, chemical dependency education, cognitive behavioral interventions, acceptance and commitment therapy techniques, anger management and trauma informed care. Residents are also eligible to receive individual therapy.
