






The Harris Center Behavioral Health and IDD Access Hub


- Available 24/7/365

The Harris Center 988 Data







- Texas: 3rd highest call volume
- In-State answer rate increase
 - 30% to 80% (and going up!)
- Increase in staff
 - Funding
 - Remote work/technology
- All 254 Texas counties covered

- Minimal Impact on LMHA services:
 - Approximately 7% of calls receive a referral to a LMHA.
- Minimal Impact on 911/Emergency Services:
 - Less than 2% of calls require an emergency response

Call Trends



 No decreases in LMHA crisis line calls – showing 988 is reaching a new demographic of caller

988 calls average longer than LMHA Crisis Line calls – 15 minutes
 vs. 10 minutes

• 988 callers are less likely to want or accept referrals (8% vs 32%), but more likely to have higher acuity (16% v 13%).





- Remote workforce capacity has led to increases of over 100% in applications received.
- Remote workforce capacity has led to ability to hire from outside the immediate Harris County area – currently 16% of Crisis Line Responders live outside Harris County.

- From Jan 2022 to June 2023 we have increased staffing 30%.
- For staff employed over 4
 months we were able to drop
 from 20% (in 2019) to 13%
 (2023) turnover rate.

What's next for 988?



• Nationally- Working with FCC on geo-routing capacity for both phone service and text service.

Texas – continue to increase in state answer rate.
