The Youth Diversion Center serves as a destination for **youth engaged with law enforcement** due to **low-level**, **non-violent crimes** and provides needed structure and support. The program provides safe housing and aims to **keep youth engaged in school** and provide **behavioral and mental health supports**.



Improve equity

Countering significant disparities from arrest through juvenile justice system



Mitigate negative impacts of arrest

Particularly BIPOC and LGBTQAI+ youth



Reduce risk of criminal socialization

Provide role models and positive peers, instill discipline, and improve school engagement

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Decrease caseloads & law enforcement costs

Reduce number of youths sent to detention facilities and number of cases for judges, prosecutors, etc.

Provide alternative to traditional processing

Reduce stigma and recidivism, and connect youth to community services




